## **Qualifiers For Membership**

There are two primary qualifiers for membership in the VFW Auxiliary.

- 1) Honorable Service—The veterans whose eligibility the applicant is using must have served in the Armed Forces of the United States and either received a discharge of Honorable or General (Under Honorable Conditions) or be currently serving.
- 2) Service in a war, campaign, or expedition on foreign soil or in hostile waters. This can be proven by any of the following:
  - An authorized campaign medal
  - Receipt of Hostile Fire Pay or Imminent Danger Pay (verified by a military pay statement).
  - Service in Korea for 30 consecutive or 60 nonconsecutive days.


This information is usually available through a veteran's DD-214. If other information is needed or if a veteran's DD-214 is not complete, they can contact the National Personnel Records Center at 314.801.0800 or online at http://www.archives.gov/veterans/evetrecs/ to request more information.

It is important that we verify the eligibility of ever member that signs up for VFW Auxiliary membership, not only to comply with our Bylaws but also to maintain the integrity of the organization.

## Army of Puerto Rico Occupation Medal

Awarded for Service members who performed military occupation duty in Puerto Rico after the close of the Spanish-American War Military Branch-Army Qualifying Dates: Aug 14, 1898-Dec 10, 1898



## **Philippine Campaign Medal**

The Philippine Campaign Medal is a medal of the United States Armed Forces which was created to denote service of U.S. military men in the Philippine-American War between the years of 1899 and 1913.

Military Branch-Army Qualifying Dates: Feb 4, 1899-Dec 31, 1913





## **Philippine Campaign Medal**

To be awarded the Philippine Campaign Medal, a Navy or Marine Corps service member was required to perform service in the Philippine Islands between the dates of February 4, 1899 and December 31, 1904. Such service was required to be either ashore in support of Army units or on board certain vessels assigned to the area of the Philippine Sea.

## **China Relief Expedition Campaign Medal**

Established on January 12, 1905, the China Campaign Medal honors United States military members who carried out service onshore in China between the dates of June 20, 1900 and May 27, 1901 as part of the China Relief Expedition during the Boxer Rebellion. ## **China Relief Expedition Campaign Medal**

The China Relief Expedition was an expedition in China undertaken by the United States Armed Forces to rescue United States citizens, European nationals, and other foreign nationals during the latter years of the Boxer Rebellion, which lasted from 1898 to 1901. Military Branch-Navy Qualifying Dates: Apr 5, 1900-May 27, 1901



## **Cuban Pacification Medal**

Established on May 11, 1909, the Army of Cuban Pacification Medal honors United States military members who carried out service onshore in Cuba between September 12, 1906 and April 1, 1909. Military Branch-Army Qualifying Dates: Oct 6, 1906-Apr 1, 1909



## **Cuban Pacification Medal**

The Cuban Pacification Medal (Navy) is a military award of the United States Navy which was created by orders of the United States Navy Department on 13 August 1909. The medal was awarded to officers and enlisted men who served ashore in Cuba between the dates of 12 September 1906 and 1 April 1909, or who were attached to a specific number of ships, for the Cuban Pacification. Established on May 11, 1909, the Cuban Pacification Medal honors United States military members who carried out service onshore in Cuba between September 12, 1906 and April 1, 1909.

## Mexican Service Medal

The Mexican Service Medal was awarded to military personnel who carried out duties against hostile Mexican parties during designated periods between 1911 and 1919 amid what is generally referred to as the Border War or Border Campaign.

Military Branch-Army Qualifying Dates: Apr 12, 1911-Jun 16, 1919



## Mexican Service Medal

Created by the United States Department of War in December 1917, the **Mexican Service Medal** was awarded to military personnel who carried out duties against hostile Mexican parties during designated periods between 1911 and 1919 amid what is generally referred to as the Border War or Border Campaign.

## First Nicaraguan Campaign Medal



Established on September 22, 1913, the **First Nicaraguan Campaign Medal** recognizes members of the United States Navy and Marine Corps who served in Nicaragua or in surrounding waters between the dates of July 29, 1912 and November 14 of the same year. Eligible vessels include the USS Annapolis, California, Cleveland, Colorado, Denver, Glacier, Maryland, and Tacoma.

## First Haitian Campaign Medal

Established in 1917, the **First Haitian Campaign Medal** honors United States Navy and Marine Corps members who carried out service in support of peacekeeping operations in Haiti between July 9 and December 6, 1915.

Military Branch–Navy Qualifying Dates: Jul 9, 1915–Dec 6, 1915 Apr 1, 1919–Jun 15, 1920



## Dominican Campaign Medal

Established on December 29, 1921, the **Dominican Campaign Medal** honors Navy and Marine Corps members who carried out service in the Dominican Republic between May 5 and December 4, 1916 during the United States' invasion of the country. **Military Branch**—Navy **Qualifying Dates**: May 4, 1916—Dec 5, 1916

## Hostile Fire or Imminent Danger Pay

**Hostile Fire and Imminent Danger Pays** are monthly special pays that compensate service members for physical danger. Hostile Fire Pay is paid to a member who meets one or more of these criteria: (1) takes hostile fire or is exposed to an explosion of a hostile mine; (2) is in a unit engaged in hostile action; (3) is killed, injured, or wounded by hostile fire or explosion of a hostile mine. Imminent Danger Pay is paid to a member who is on duty in foreign areas where they are subject to the threat of physical harm or imminent danger because of civil insurrection, civil war, terrorism, or wartime conditions. Although DOD regulations distinguish between Hostile Fire Pay and Imminent Danger Pay, they are derived from the same statute. An individual can collect one or the other, but not both simultaneously.

## Military Branch-All

Hostile Fire or Imminent Danger Pay can be verified on a Military Pay Statement.







## Iraq Campaign Medal (ICM)

The Iraq Campaign Medal honors United States military personnel who carry out service in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom on or subsequent to March 19, 2003.

To qualify, service must have lasted at least 30 days consecutively or 60 days non-consecutively. The term of requirement may be waived if service carried out entailed armed combat; injury necessitating medical evacuation; for members of flight crews flying sorties, every day operating is measured as an eligible day. Service must have taken place in Iraq or in water or airspace within 12 nautical miles of the country's borders.

Air Force Expeditionary Service with GOLD BORDER (AFESR)

The Air Force Expeditionary Service Ribbon honors members of the United States Air Force who carry out standard contingency deployments for a term of either 45 days consecutively or 90 days non-consecutively. The addition of the frame was authorized in 2004 to recognize personnel who engaged in combat in a designated zone. The frame is only awarded to personnel who have already qualified for the Air Force.

## Inherent Resolve Campaign Medal



The Inherent Resolve Campaign Medal may be awarded to members of the U.S. Army, Navy, Marine Corps, Air Force, and Coast Guard, for service in Iraq, Syria, or contiguous waters or airspace retroactively from 15 June 2014 to a date yet to be determined. Service members who were awarded the Global War on Terrorism Expeditionary Medal for service that is now covered by the Inherent Resolve Campaign Medal may make application to be awarded the Inherent Resolve Campaign Medal in lieu of the Global War on Terrorism Expeditionary Medal.

## World War I Victory Medal (with battle or service clasp including Siberia and European Russia)

## **Army Occupation of Germany**

Established on November 21, 1941, the Army of Occupation of Germany Medal honors United States military members who carried out occupation service in Germany of Austria-Hungary in the aftermath of World War I. To qualify, service must have taken place between November 12, 1918 and July 11, 1923.

## Second Nicaraguan Campaign Medal

Authorized by the United States Congress on November 8, 1929, the Second Nicaraguan Campaign Medal honors members of the U.S. Navy for service in Nicaragua. This service must have taken place in a naval operation carried out at any point from August 27, 1926 and January 2, 1933.

## Yangtze Service Medal

The Yangtze Service Medal is a decoration of the United States military which was created in 1930 for presentation to members of the United States Navy and United States Marine Corps. Personnel who served with a landing force in Shanghai during these operations were also eligible for the medal.

## China Service Medal (CHISM)

Established on August 23, 1940, the **China Service Medal** honor members of the United States Navy, Marine Corps, and Coast Guard who carried out service between July 7, 1937 and September 7, 1939 and/or between September 2, 1945 and April 1, 1957. To be eligible, personnel must have served on shore in China or on designated vessels supporting operations in China.

### American Defense Service Medal (ADSM) (with foreign service clasp)

The **American Defense Service Medal** was a military award of the United States Armed Forces, established by Executive Order 8808, by President Franklin D. Roosevelt, on June 28, 1941.[1][2] The medal was intended to recognize those military service members who had served on active duty between September 8, 1939, and December 7, 1941.

## Korea Defense Service Medal (KDSM)

Established in February of 2004, the **Korean Defense Service Medal** honors members of the United States military who carried out service in Korea or its surrounding waters and airspace for a term of thirty days consecutively or sixty days nonconsecutively. **Military Branch**-All

**Global War on Terrorism Expeditionary Medal (GWOTEM)** Established on March 12, 2003, the **Global War on Terrorism Expeditionary Medal** honors military personnel who have carried out service on overseas deployments in support of efforts in the War on Terror on or after September 11, 2001. It is used primarily to recognize service in countries other than Iraq and Afghanistan, which have their own corresponding campaign medals. To qualify, individuals must serve in designated operations for a minimum term of either 30 days consecutively or 60 days nonconsecutively. In lieu of the term requirement, service involving combat engagement with hostile forces and danger of bodily harm may qualify, and service members participating in flight sorties in eligible areas may also qualify.

**European-African-Middle Eastern Campaign Medal (EAME)** Established on November 6, 1942, the **European – African – Middle Eastern Campaign Medal** (EAME) honors military personnel who carried out service in the European Theater during World War II. Initially awarded as a ribbon, the medal was authorized in July of 1947. **Military Branch**—Army & Navy **Qualifying Dates**: Dec 7, 1941—Nov 8, 1945





## Afghanistan Campaign Medal (ACM)

The **Afghanistan Campaign Medal** honors United States military personnel who carried out service in the country of Afghanistan or its airspace. It may also be awarded to personnel who lost their life while serving in Afghanistan. In order to be eligible, recipients must have served in Afghanistan for a term of thirty days consecutively or a total of sixty days non-consecutively. Additionally, service members who engaged in combat or were wounded in combat against hostile forces in Afghanistan may be eligible without regard to the required service interval. **Military Branch**—All






## Air Force Combat Action Medal (AFCAM)

The **Air Force Combat Action Medal** was established on March 15, 2007 to recognize members of the United States Air Force for active participation in air or ground combat. In order to be eligible, personnel must have experienced direct enemy fire in an unsecured location or directly engaged enemy forces with fire. The Air Force Combat Action Medal may be granted to foreign soldiers or members of other US military branches carrying out service in an Air Force unit. **Military Branch**—Air Force & Space Force **Qualifying Dates**—Sep 11, 2001—Open





## Combat Action Badge (CAB)

The **Combat Action Badge** (CAB) is a United States military award given to soldiers of the U.S. Army of any rank and who are not members of an infantry, special forces, or medical MOS, for being "present and actively engaging or being engaged by the enemy, and performing satisfactorily in accordance with prescribed rules of engagement" at any point in time after 18 September 2001.

## SSBN Deterrent Patrol Insignia

## Asiatic-Pacific Campaign Medal (APCM)

Established on November 6, 1942, the **Asiatic Pacific Campaign Medal** honors United States Military personnel who carried out service during World War II in the Pacific Theater between the years of 1941 and 1945. Initially awarded as a service ribbon, the medal version was approved in 1947 with General Douglas MacArthur as its first recipient.

## Army of Occupation (AOM)

(30 consecutive days of duty)

The **Army of Occupation Medal** is a military award of the United States military which was established by the United States War Department on 5 April 1946. The medal was created in the aftermath of the Second World War to recognize those who had performed occupation service in either Germany, Italy, Austria, Japan or Korea. The original Army of Occupation Medal was intended only for members of the United States Army, but was expanded in 1948 to encompass the United States Air Force shortly after that service's creation.


## Navy Occupation Service Medal



The **Navy Occupation Service Medal** is a military award of the United States Navy which was "Awarded to commemorate the services of Navy, Marine Corps and Coast Guard personnel in the occupation of certain territories of the enemies of the United States during World War II" and recognized those personnel who participated in the European and Asian occupation forces during, and following World War II. The medal was also bestowed to personnel who performed duty in West Berlin between 1945 and 1990.

## Combat Infantry Badge (CIB)

The badge is awarded to infantrymen and Special Forces soldiers in the rank of colonel and below, who fought in active ground combat while assigned as members of either an Infantry or Special Forces unit of brigade size or smaller at any time after 6 December 1941. **Military Branch**—Army

## Combat Medical Badge (CMB)

Any member of the Army Medical Department, at the rank of colonel or below, who is assigned or attached to a ground combat arms unit of brigade or smaller size which provides medical support during any period in which the unit was engaged in ground combat is eligible for the CMB.

## Combat Action Ribbon (CAR)

Coast Guardsmen, Navy sailors, and Marines active in clandestine, stealth or special operations are deemed eligible for consideration of the award. For a military member to be awarded a **Combat Action Ribbon** evidence must establish the member engaged the enemy, was under hostile fire, or was physically attacked by the enemy. The service member must have demonstrated satisfactory performance under enemy fire while actively participating in a ground or surface engagement **Military Branch**—Navy, Marine, Coast Guard **Qualifying Dates**—Dec 6, 1941—Open

## Korean Service Medal (KSM)

Established in November of 1950, the **Korean Service Medal** honors United States Armed Forces personnel who carried out service in Korea between the dates of June 27, 1950 and July 27, 1954 during and shortly after the Korean War.

Marine Corps Navy and Marine Corps Expeditionary Medal Established on August 15, 1936, the Navy Expeditionary Medal honors U.S. Navy members who have participated in a foreign landing, engaged in combat against an enemy force, or carried out service in qualifying operations for which there is no other corresponding award. Established on May 8, 1919, the Marine Corps Expeditionary Medal honors Marine Corps members who participated in a foreign landing, engaged in combat against an enemy force, or carried out service in qualifying operations for which there is no other corresponding award.



## **Southwest Asia Service Medal (SWASM)** Established on March 12, 1991, the **Southwest Asia Service Medal** honors United States military personnel who carried out service in Operation Desert Shield or Operation Desert Storm.

## Kosovo Campaign Medal (KCM)



Established on May 3, 2000, the **Kosovo Campaign Medal** honors United States military personnel who carried out service in qualifying operations in central and eastern Europe and around the Mediterranean for a minimum term of 30 days consecutively or 60 days nonconsecutively. The award includes the Kosovo Air Campaign, which took place between March 24 and June 10, 1999 in Albania, Bosnia, Bulgaria, Croatia, Greece, Hungary, Italy, Macedonia, Montenegro, Slovenia, and surrounding air and waters in the Adriatic and Ionian Seas; it also covers the Kosovo Defense Campaign between June 11, 1999 and an undetermined date in Albania, Macedonia, Montenegro, and Serbia (Kosovo included) as well as air and water around the relevant Adriatic coastlines.

## Vietnam Medal (VSM)

To qualify, service must have lasted at least 30 days consecutively or 60 days non-consecutively, or for one or more days in direct support of ground or naval operations in designated combat zones in Cambodia, Laos, Thailand, or Vietnam.

## Armed Forces Expeditionary Medal
